Petrole Brasileiro SA (Petrobras) is one of Brazil's largest energy companies. It is engaged in the exploration and production of crude oil, refining, processing, transport, distribution, and trading of petroleum products, natural gas, biofuels and electricity. The company operates 112 production platforms, which includes 78 fixed, 34 floating and 15 refineries. It operates through five reportable business segments: Exploration and Production, Supply, Gas and Energy, Distribution and International. The company is headquartered in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil.

Financial performance

The company reported revenues of R\$215,118.54 million during the fiscal year ended December 2008, an increase of 26.11% over 2007. The operating profit of the company was R\$48,204.80 million during the fiscal year, an increase of 35.64% over 2007.

The net profit of the company was R\$34,332.32 million, an increase of 52.43% over 2007. As of 31 December 2008, Petrobras held 186 exploration agreements, which covered 256 blocks and 35 evaluation plans.
