PetroChina Company Limited (PetroChina) is an integrated energy company. It is present across the entire energy value chain including the exploration, development, production and sales of crude oil and natural gas. It is also engaged in the refining, transportation, storage and marketing of crude oil and petroleum products. It produces and sells basic petrochemical products, derivative chemical products and other chemical products, and transmits natural gas, crude oil and refined products. The company is the largest natural gas transporter and seller in China in terms of sales volume. PetroChina is a subsidiary of state-owned China National Petroleum Corporation (CNPC). The company produces two thirds of China's total oil and gas generation. It principally operates in China and is headquartered in Beijing.

In May 2009, PetroChina entered into an agreement through its indirectly wholly owned subsidiary, PetroChina International (Singapore) Pte Ltd to acquire a 45.51% stake in Singapore Petroleum Company Limited from Keppel Oil and Gas Services Pte Ltd.

Financial performance

The company reported revenues of 1,071,146.00 million yuan during the fiscal year ended December 2008, an increase of 28.07% over 2007. The operating profit of the company was 149,332.00 million yuan during the fiscal year 2008, a decrease of 27.52% from 2007. The net profit of the company was 113,798.00 million yuan, a decrease of 21.99% from 2007.
